


DR. DWAYNE A. WALKER CANDIDATE FOR BISHOP ZION BORN | ZION BRED

Rev. Dr. Dwayne Anthony Walker was born in Rock Hill, South Carolina. He later moved with his family to Chicago, Illinois, where he received his early education in the Chicago Public Schools. He is a graduate of Livingstone College, Salisbury, North Carolina where he received the Bachelor of Arts Degree in Political Science.

After accepting the call to preach, he enrolled at Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington, D.C. While a student, he served as Assistant Pastor for Youth and Young Adult Ministry at John Wesley A.M.E. Zion Church in Washington, D.C.

He received the Master of Divinity Degree in 1989 and in June that year, he was appointed Pastor of Metropolitan A.M.E. Zion Church in Detroit, Michigan. In November of 1994, Dr. Walker was appointed to serve as Pastor of Jones Tabernacle A.M.E. Zion Church, Indianapolis, Indiana. In addition to serving as Pastor of Jones Tabernacle, Dr. Walker served as Administrator of Kuumba Horizons Child Development Center. He was also a member of the board of Celebration of Hope, member of the board of Volunteers of America and a member of the Advisory Board of United Negro College Fund. In May 2004, Dr. Walker received the Doctor of Ministry degree from Wesley Theological Seminary, Washington, D.C.

InSeptember of 2005, hewas appointed as pastor of Little Rock A.M.E. Zion Church, Charlotte, North Carolina. Dr. Walker currently serves as a member of The Board of Trustees of Livingstone College, The Board of Dorothy Walls Conference and Retreat Center, member of The Black Political Caucus, The NAACP, the Chairman of the Little Rock Community Development Corporation, a former member of the Charlotte Mecklenburg Planning Commission and Vice Chair of the Charlotte Mecklenburg Community Relations Committee.



Since Dr. Dwayne A. Walker's appointment as the pastor in 2005, some ways in which the Little Rock Church has advanced include and he has served Zion include:

- Restructured and modified the Class Leader System for greater impact to serve the congregation.
- The Little Rock Logo/Brand was developed, making the church recognizable worldwide.
- Purchased and burned the mortgage of the former Little Rock Church building, expanding the footprint of Zion in the prime location of uptown Charlotte.
- Founded the Little Rock Community Development Corporation.
- Serves the AME Zion Church including successfully hosting the AME Zion General Conference in 2012.
- Served as a delegate to the World Methodist Council in Seoul, Korea and London, England.
- Served on the National Council of Churches Justice Committee.
- Serves on the Connectional Budget Board as well as the Executive Committee of the Connectional Budget Board.
- Serves as a member of the Board of Trustees of Livingstone College.
- Became the "Face and Voice of Zion" during the Black Lives Matter civil unrest against racial and social injustice rallies, leading protests and being interviewed locally as well as by commercial and cable news reporters.
- Hosted many local, state and national leaders, including Secretary Hillary R. Clinton, Congress-woman Alma S. Adams, Governor Roy Cooper, etc, while establishing Little Rock as the leader in a wide diaspora of humankind.
- Established the C.D. Rippy Scholarship Fund.
- Initiated the Little Rock Excellence in Ministry Radio Broadcast on Praise 100.9.
- Negotiated opportunities to generate revenue opportunities to increase cash flow for sustainable ministry.
- Strongly advocated for affordable housing in Charlotte resulting in the city granting Little Rock Community Development Corporation the land adjacent to the current Little Rock structures and parking to build a 105 unit apartment building with 50% designated for affordable housing. This
 - is a tremendous footprint of Zion in this major metropolitan city, a \$15 million dollar project adding value without adding debt.
- Little Rock now has more than 60 ministries and is open daily for member growth and development and community service.
- Church attendance continues to increase and the membership continues to grow.





Growth of a Healthy Church is exemplified at Little Rock through the "Excellence in Ministry" mantra, where God is Glorified, Jesus is Magnified, the People are Edified, Faith is Fortified and Ministry is Multiplied.

GLOBAL MISSIONS EXPERIENCE

Dr. Dwayne Anthony Walker was a part of a delegation of The Mid West Episcopal District who traveled with Bishop Enoch B. Rochester to South Africa and Malawi, Central Africa in 1997. He was also a member of the Delegation to The World Methodist Council in Seoul, Korea in 2006. He was a part of The

AME Zion Delegation that traveled to London, England in 2013 for The World Methodist Council. As an active participant in AME Zion Conferences, Dr. Walker has traveled to our work in Jamaica both in Montego Bay and Kingston at least the past 15 years.
